From the President's Desk

My apologies for getting this edition out a bit late. I wanted to wait until the absentee votes had been counted from the recent election so that I could list the incoming council members and delegates in this newsletter.

By the time you read this newsletter my time as president of Geneva Lodge 2397 will be nearing it's end. Three years is a long time to lead a lodge such as ours. You not only need to be a lodge president, but also a CEO of a multi faceted business. Success or failure in this venture depends on the help of a tremendous group of member volunteers, and I can honestly say that I had a great group of them throughout the past three years. I can never thank them all enough for making our lodge look good, not only here in our local community, but throughout the Sons & Daughters of Italy organization statewide. Geneva Lodge has led the state in bringing in new members over the past three years, and considering that we have been dealing with a pandemic over the past two years, that is quite an accomplishment that everyone should be proud of. That success is based on the fact that we have strived to provide quality events here that both members and the public can enjoy, and that has led to people wanting to join. There is no real secret to this success. Make people feel welcome. Embrace them as new friends and they will want to become part of a progressive organization.

Through the past two years we continued to show that the Sons & Daughters of Italy care about our local community. Our members rang the bells for the Salvation Army's Red Kettle Drive each December. We collected food items and cash for the Geneva Center of Concern. We continued our annual Wreath Laying Ceremony at the Torrey Park Monument. We allowed both civic and religious groups space to meet at the lodge free of charge. We donated to local causes to help them meet their own fundraising goals. This combination of many things has continued to help us meet our own goal of "promoting a positive image of Italian Americans."

Most members, except those who have been members for 30 years or more, may not know that this is my third time serving as president of Geneva Lodge. I joined the lodge way back in 1977 when it first formed and became president for the first time in 1995 and served two one year terms. I ran again in 1999 and served for another two years, mostly because no one at that time was ready, or willing, to step up. We then went through a period where several younger members who had become council members each stepped up to take a turn at being president. That is actually the way you would hope a lodge progresses, where members move up through the ranks, keep learning, and then move up to president. However, it seems like that process hasn't quite worked out over the past several years. Fewer and fewer people are willing to assume leadership positions. Now, members who are willing can move up to becoming lodge president after just one term on a council. That makes the job quite a bit tougher.

This leadership shortage is what led me to taking on the presidency here once again. It's not really something I had planned on doing.



But now, this is my last hurrah. It's time to pass the torch and for others to assume the leadership roles. I wish everyone who assumes the mantle of leadership great success. Keeping this lodge going is worth the effort. Once again, *mille grazie a tutti* to everyone who helped make me look good over the years.
